Jesus is the Light of the World [part 2](John 8:21-30)

Scripture Text:

- 21. Then He said again to them, "I go away, and you will seek Me, and will die in your sin; where I am going, you cannot come."
- 22. So the Jews were saying, "Surely He will not kill Himself, will He, since He says, 'Where I am going, you cannot come'?"
- 23. And He was saying to them, "You are from below, I am from above; you are of this world, I am not of this world.
- 24. Therefore I said to you that you will die in your sins; for unless you believe that I am He, you will die in your sins."
- 25. So they were saying to Him, "Who are You?" Jesus said to them, "What have I been saying to you from the beginning?
- 26. I have many things to speak and to judge concerning you, but He who sent Me is true; and the things which I heard from Him, these I speak to the world."
- 27. They did not realize that He had been speaking to them about the Father.
- 28. So Jesus said, "When you lift up the Son of Man, then you will know that I am He, and I do nothing on My own initiative, but I speak these things as the Father taught Me.
- 29. And He who sent Me is with Me; He has not left Me alone, for I always do the things that are pleasing to Him."
- 30. As He spoke these things, many came to believe in Him. (JOHN 8:21-30 NASB)

- b. "Surely He will not kill Himself, will He, since He says, 'Where I am going, you cannot come' ?" (v.22) [self-righteous]
 - i. The Jews once again show themselves to be completely and utterly spiritually bankrupt and carnal in their thinking. What did they assume

- ii. As a result of their willful misunderstanding of what Jesus was going to do and the implications that would follow, where did the Jews believe Jesus was going?
- iii. What would be the implications of this for Jesus from the perspective of the Jews and their teachings?
- iv. What where their assumptions about themselves and their eternal destination?
- c. "You are from below, I am from above; you are of this world, I am not of this world." (v.23) *[earth-bound]*
 - i. "And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing, in whose case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelieving so that they might not see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God." (2 CORINTHIANS 4:3-4 NASB)
 - ii. "The first man [Adam] is from the earth, earthy; the second man [Jesus] is from heaven. As is the earthy, so also are those who are earthy; and as is the heavenly, so also are those who are heavenly. Just as we have borne the image of the earthy, we will also bear the image of the heavenly." (1 CORINTHIANS 15:47-49 NASB)
 - iii. "Do not love the world nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the **boastful pride of life**, is not from the Father, but is from the world. The world is passing away, and also its lusts; **but the one who does the will of God lives forever**." (1 JOHN 2:15-17 NASB)
- d. "Therefore I said to you that you will die in your sins; for unless you believe that I am He, you will die in your sins." (v.24) [unbelieving]
 - In these verses (vv.21-24), Jesus reveals the consequences of rejecting Him as God, The Messiah and Son of God? What is the consequence of rejecting Jesus Christ? ______ (v.24; Hebrews 10:26-31)
 - ii. "For if we go on sinning willfully after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, but a terrifying expectation of judgment and the fury of a fire which will consume the adversaries. Anyone who has set aside the Law of Moses dies without mercy on the testimony of two or three witnesses. How much severer punishment do you think he will deserve who has trampled under foot the Son of God, and has regarded as unclean the blood of the covenant

by which he was sanctified, and has **insulted the Spirit of grace**? For we know Him who said, "vengeance is mine, I will repay." And again, "the Lord will judge his people." **It is a terrifying thing to fall into the hands of the living God**." (HEBREWS 10:26-31 NASB)

- II. Who are you Jesus? (vv.25-27) [willful ignorance]
 - a. So they were saying to Him, "Who are You?" (v.25a)
 - i. What do you suppose the Jews wanted Jesus to say in response to this question?
 - ii. When Jesus finally and plainly stated who He was/is, what was their response? (Matt. 26:62-68)
 - iii. "The high priest stood up and said to Him, "Do You not answer? What is it that these men are testifying against You?" But Jesus kept silent. And the high priest said to Him, "I adjure You by the living God, that You tell us whether You are the Christ, the Son of God." Jesus said to him, "You have said it yourself; nevertheless I tell you, hereafter you will see the son of man sitting at the right hand of power, and coming on the clouds of heaven." Then the high priest tore his robes and said, "He has blasphemed! What further need do we have of witnesses? Behold, you have now heard the blasphemy; what do you think?" They answered, "He deserves death!" Then they spat in His face and beat Him with their fists; and others slapped Him, and said, "Prophesy to us, You Christ; who is the one who hit You?" (MATTHEW 26:62-68 NASB)
 - b. Jesus said to them, "What have I been saying to you from the beginning?" (v.25b)
 - i. In the case of Jesus' identity and the gospel message, it is not that the Jews ______ believe, it is more accurate to say they believe.
 - ii. For those who hear and **don't** or **won't** believe:
 - "And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing, in whose case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelieving so that they might not see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. (2 CORINTHIANS 4:3-4 NASB)
 - 2. For in the case of those who have once been enlightened and have tasted of the heavenly gift and have been made partakers of the Holy Spirit, and have tasted the good word of God and the powers of the age to come, and then have fallen away, it is impossible to renew them again to repentance, since they again crucify to themselves the Son of God and put Him to open shame. (HEBREWS 6:4-6 NASB)

- iii. For those who hear and do or will believe:
 - 1. "And you He made alive, who were dead in trespasses and sins, in which you once walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit who now works in the sons of disobedience, among whom also we all once conducted ourselves in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, just as the others. (Ephesians 2:1-3 NKJV)
 - 2. With some people it doesn't matter how many times or how man different ways you say something, they just *don't* understand or *won't* believe.
 - 3. In the case of these Pharisees (doctors of the Law, religious elite, rulers of the Jews, members of the Sanhedrin, etc.) was it likely that they couldn't believe (ignorance) or more likely that they wouldn't believe (willful unbelieve)? [discussion]

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- c. "I have many things to speak and to judge concerning you..." (v.26)
 - i. Jesus had many personal things that He could have said to the Jews at this time in righteous judgment, but He came to speak the words of His Father "to the world" (v.26) instead.
 - ii. What are some of the things that Jesus did say to the Jews in judgement? (Matthew 23) [read]
 - 1. Jesus exposes the Pharisees and Sadducees in front of the people (Matt 23:1-12)
 - 2. Jesus declares His famous (or infamous depending on your perspective) "Eight Woes" (Matt 23:13-36)
 - 3. Jesus laments over Israel's (the Jews') unbelief as a nation (Matt 23:37-39)
- d. "They did not realize that He had been speaking to them about the Father." (v.27)
 - The Jews did not realize that Jesus was speaking about God the Father because these things were/are ______ discerned. (I Cor. 2:14)

- ii. "Yet we do speak wisdom among those who are mature; a wisdom, however, not of this age nor of the rulers of this age, who are passing away; but we speak God's wisdom in a mystery, the hidden wisdom which God predestined before the ages to our glory; the wisdom which none of the rulers of this age has understood; for if they had understood it they would not have crucified the Lord of glory;... For who among men knows the thoughts of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so the thoughts of God no one knows except the Spirit of God. Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may know the things freely given to us by God, which things we also speak, not in words taught by human wisdom, but in those taught by the Spirit, combining spiritual thoughts with spiritual words. But a natural man does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; and he cannot understand them, because they are spiritually appraised." (1 CORINTHIANS 2:6-8, 11-14 NASB)
- III. Jesus foretells the time when they will know Who He is and Who sent Him (vv.28-30)
 - a. "Jesus said, 'When you lift up the Son of Man, then you will know that I am He, ..." (v.28)
 - i. "Now My soul has become troubled; and what shall I say, 'Father, save Me from this hour'? But for this purpose I came to this hour. Father, glorify Your name." Then a voice came out of heaven: "I have both glorified it, and will glorify it again." So the crowd of people who stood by and heard it were saying that it had thundered; others were saying, "An angel has spoken to Him." Jesus answered and said, "This voice has not come for My sake, but for your sakes. Now judgment is upon this world; now the ruler of this world will be cast out. And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to Myself." But He was saying this to indicate the kind of death by which He was to die." (JOHN 12:27-33 NASB)
 - ii. And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice, and yielded up His spirit. And behold, the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom; and the earth shook and the rocks were split. The tombs were opened, and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised; and coming out of the tombs after His resurrection they entered the holy city and appeared to many. Now the centurion, and those who were with him keeping guard over Jesus, when they saw the earthquake and the things that were happening, became very frightened and said, "Truly this was the Son of God!" (MATTHEW 27:50-54 NASB)
 - b. "And He who sent Me is with Me; He has not left Me alone, for I always do the things that are pleasing to Him." (v.29)
