- 8. Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you double-minded.
- 9. Be miserable and mourn and weep; let your laughter be turned into mourning and your joy to gloom.
- 10. Humble yourselves in the presence of the Lord, and He will exalt you. (James 4:1-10 NASB1995)



- I. Avoid Quarreling and Conflicts (v.1-3)
 - a. What is the source of quarrels and conflicts among you? Is not the source your pleasures that wage war in your members? (v.1)
 - i. James gives his readers yet another question. This question is a question that He gives the answer to in the very next verse, but he wants his

 - Mortify therefore your **members** which are upon the earth; fornication, uncleanness, inordinate affection, evil **concupiscence**, and covetousness, which is idolatry: (Colossians 3:5 KJV)
 - For this is the will of God, even your sanctification, that ye should abstain from fornication: That every one of you should know how to possess his vessel in sanctification and honor; Not in the lust of concupiscence, even as the Gentiles which know not God: (1 Thessalonians 4:3-5 KJV)
- what is the result of this war that rages in the members of a believer if they don't give themselves over completely to the leading, guiding and control of the Holy Spirit? What happens to the combatants in a war?
 What does that look like from a spiritual perspective? [discussion]
- b. You lust and do not have; so you commit murder. You are envious and cannot obtain; so you fight and quarrel. You do not have because you do not ask. (v.2)
 - i. What can happen if a person's lusts are not satisfied over time according to this verse?



- ii. Does a person's lusts every get satisfied, or is there a natural tendency to want more and more no matter how much one indulges in the pleasures of sin? [discussion]
- iii. What is the alternative for the believer? [discussion]
 - By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, choosing rather to endure illtreatment with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin, considering the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures of Egypt; for he was looking to the reward. (Hebrews 11:24-26 NASB1995)
 - 2. Therefore if you have been raised up with Christ, keep seeking the things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your mind on the things above, not on the things that are on earth. For you have died and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, who is our life, is revealed, then you also will be revealed with Him in glory. Therefore consider the members of your earthly body as dead to immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed, which amounts to idolatry. For it is because of these things that the wrath of God will come upon the sons of disobedience, and in them you also once walked, when you were living in them. (Colossians 3:1-7 NASB1995)
 - 3. For this is the will of God, your sanctification; that is, that you abstain from sexual immorality; that each of you know how to possess his own vessel in sanctification and honor, not in lustful passion, like the Gentiles who do not know God; and that no man transgress and defraud his brother in the matter because the Lord is the avenger in all these things, just as we also told you before and solemnly warned you. For God has not called us for the purpose of impurity, but in sanctification. So, he who rejects this is not rejecting man but the God who gives His Holy Spirit to you. (1 Thessalonians 4:3-8 NASB1995)

- For I am jealous for you with a godly jealousy; for I betrothed you to one husband, so that to Christ I might present you as a pure virgin. (2 Corinthians 11:2 NASB1995)

- b. Or do you think that the Scripture speaks to no purpose: "He jealously desires the Spirit which He has made to dwell in us"? (v.5)
 - God, like a husband whose wife is unfaithful to him is "jealous", but God's jealousy has to do with His desire for the Holy Spirit to dwell in us after making it possible for Him (the Holy Spirit) to do so.
 - ii. Some interpret this word "Spirit" as "spirit", which would make reference to the human spirit that God breathed into man (the immaterial part of man that survives the death of the body and is eternal) and His desire is that the inner man have intimate, eternal fellowship with Him. This can only happen when a person is faithful to God demonstrating genuine, saving faith!
 - iii. Does the phrase, "the Spirit which He has made to dwell in us" suggest that the Holy Spirit was "made" by God? _____ If not, then what does it mean? [discussion] _____

- iv. "He has made to dwell" *katoikeo* to dwell, settle; metaph. divine powers, influences, etc., are said to dwell in his soul, to pervade, prompt, govern it; to dwell in, inhabit. God is said to dwell in the temple, i.e. to be always present for worshippers.
 - For the Lord your God is a consuming fire, a jealous God. (Deuteronomy 4:24 NASB1995)
 - 2. —for you shall not worship any other god, for the Lord , whose name is Jealous, is a jealous God— (Exodus 34:14 NASB1995)
 - for the Lord your God in the midst of you is a jealous God; otherwise the anger of the Lord your God will be kindled against you, and He will wipe you off the face of the earth. (Deuteronomy 6:15 NASB1995)
 - You shall not worship them or serve them; for I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children, and on the third and the fourth generations of those who hate Me, (Deuteronomy 5:9 NASB1995)
 - 5. They made Him jealous with strange gods; With abominations they provoked Him to anger. (Deuteronomy 32:16 NASB1995)
 - A jealous and avenging God is the Lord ; The Lord is avenging and wrathful. The Lord takes vengeance on His adversaries, And He reserves wrath for His enemies. (Nahum 1:2 NASB1995)
- III. Avoid Pride (v.6-7)
 - a. But He gives a greater grace. Therefore it says, "God is opposed to the proud, but gives grace to the humble ." (v.6)

 - If a person is to "submit to God" he/she cannot at the same time "submit" to the devil. Instead believers are command and admonished to "resist" the devil.
 - "Submit" *hypotasso* This word was a Greek military term meaning "to arrange [troop divisions] in a military fashion under the command of a leader".

 - a. Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you double-minded. (v.8)
 - In this verse we see the converse of the preceding verse. As a believer

 - b. Be miserable and mourn and weep; let your laughter be turned into mourning and your joy to gloom. (v.9)

- iv. What does this suggest about a person who truly understands the grace, mercy and forgiveness of God? [discussion] ______
 - For You do not delight in sacrifice, otherwise I would give it; You are not pleased with burnt offering. The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; A broken and a contrite heart, O God, You will not despise. (Psalms 51:16-17 NASB1995)
 - 2. For the sorrow that is according to the will of God produces a repentance without regret, leading to salvation, but the sorrow of the world produces death. (2 Corinthians 7:10 NASB1995)
- v. **Application**: We live in a world where people are not sorry for, nor do they morn over their own personal sin. They seem to not even be aware of the magnitude of their sin. Quite the contrary, they seem to laugh and revel in their own sin and the sins of others.
 - 1. And just as they did not see fit to acknowledge God any longer, God gave them over to a depraved mind, to do those things which are not proper, being filled with all unrighteousness, wickedness, greed, evil; full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, malice; they are gossips, slanderers, haters of God, insolent, arrogant, boastful, inventors of evil, disobedient to parents, without understanding, untrustworthy, unloving, unmerciful; and although they know the ordinance of God, that those who practice such things are worthy of death, they not only do the same, but also give hearty approval to those who practice them. (Romans 1:28-32 NASB1995)
 - For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, because that which is known about God is evident within them; for God made it evident to them. (Romans 1:18-19 NASB1995)
- c. Humble yourselves in the presence of the Lord, and He will exalt you. (v.10)
 - i. "The way up, is the way down."
 - ii. "It is better to be humble, than to be humbled, by God."
 - But the brother of humble circumstances is to glory in his high position; and the rich man is to glory in his humiliation, because like flowering grass he will pass away. (James 1:9-10 NASB1995)
 - Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you at the proper time, casting all your anxiety on Him, because He cares for you. (1 Peter 5:6-7 NASB1995)
